### Why am I being offered Accelerated Status?

#### Who is Eligible?

Students that have earned at least 22 Manitoba high school credits in three years or less, and have completed at least one credit at the 40S or 41G levels are eligible to be considered for this status. If you have not taken a 40S or 41G level course, you must have a minimum grade point average
